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NOTE FROM THE VICE CHANCELLOR (ACTING)

This report seeks to present an overview of the activities and achievements of the University for 2017 -18. The University has continued the journey of high level legal education with the help of an excellent team of faculty members.

The admission of students to B.A LL.B (Hons) and LL.M Programmes (One Year) was held on a basis of National Level Admission Test (CLAT). The University is a premier law University. The Twelfth Convocation was held on Sunday, 10th December, 2017 and was presided over by Hon'ble Chief Justice of India and Chancellor of the University, Shri Justice Dipak Misra. Professor Dr. Bhupinder Singh Chimni, an erstwhile Vice Chancellor of the University graced the occasion as the Chief Guest. The Convocation Address was delivered by Hon'ble Justice Shri Dipak Misra, Hon'ble Chief Justice of India and Chancellor of the University. At the said Convocation several students received B.A LL.B (Hons) degree and LL.M degree including two students received Ph.D Degree. Gold Medal was awarded to several students.

Various Endowment Lectures were organized like Durga Das Basu Endowment Lecture was delivered on the topic "Constitutionalism In Comparative Perspective" by Professor Mahendra Pal Singh, Visiting Professor, National Law School, Delhi held on 17th February 2018. Fifth M.K. Nambyar Endowment Lecture was organized on 25th November 2017 and the lecture on Social Change Through Law: Butterfly Politics was delivered by Professor Catherine Mackinnon, Elizabeth A. Long Professor of Law, University of Michigan. The Eleventh Keshab Chandra Basu Memorial Lecture was delivered by Professor M. Govinda Rao, Emeritus Professor, National Institute of Public Finance and Policy, on Monday, December 04, 2017 on "Reviving Investment and Sustaining High Growth: Need to Build State Capacity".

Legal Clinic of the University is providing continuous service to the people in need of legal aid. Legal Aid Society provides legal awareness, extending legal aid to the victims of human trafficking and children in need of care or children opposed to law. In various parts of West Bengal activities and programmes have been organised.

Kanishk Garg; Parth Hitendra Gala, Soham Chakraborty and Aastha Malhotra were awarded for the Aditya Birla Scholarship 2017. Apart from this several students get the benefit of the Merit cum Means Scholarship Programme initiated by the University.

The NUJS Moot Court Society in association with Herbert Smith Freehills LLP organized the 10th National Corporate Law Moot Court Competition from 2nd to 4th March, 2018. Apart from the students participated in several prestigious moot competition in the National and International levels and have won.

Students have participated in several debating and quizzing activities. The University hosted the Parliamentary Debate from the 25th of January 2018 to 28th January 2018. NUJS Model United Nations Society organized its first Intra MUN to encourage and empower the students of the University from 12th January to 14th January 2018.

The University has also achieved several other distinctions. The list would be ever unending for being covered in this short sphere.

It is a matter of great pride for the University that one of the students Ms. Mihika Poddar has been awarded Rhodes scholarship. Mr. Pranjal Sinha has won a Weinstein JAMS International Fellowship Programme in Harvard Law School. That apart the students participated in the First National Bilateral Investment Treaty.

Leading law firms and other corporate houses have also absorbed many of the students on the basis of their academic achievements.

The Student Body has also successfully organized multiple events that attracted participation from other law schools across the country. The students also participated in various sports activities and achieved success.

Chapter I

The University Statute – Relevant Provisions

ANNUAL REPORT (Clause 26 of the Schedule to the WBNUJS Act)

1. The Executive Council shall prepare the Annual Report containing such particulars as the General Council may specify, covering each financial year, and submit it to the General Council on or before such date as may be prescribed by the regulations. The General Council may pass resolutions thereon and the Executive Council shall take action in accordance therewith. The action taken shall be intimated to the General Council.
2. Copies of the Annual Report, along with the resolution of the General Council thereon, shall be submitted to the State Government. The State Government shall lay the same before the State Legislature at the earliest session.

ANNUAL ACCOUNTS AND AUDIT (Clause 24 of the Schedule to the WBNUJS Act)

1. The Annual Accounts of the University shall be prepared under the direction of the Executive Council.
2. The auditors appointed by the Executive Council shall audit the accounts of the Executive Council.
3. The General Council shall consider the annual accounts, for approval, at the annual meeting. The General Council may pass resolutions with reference thereto and communicate the same to the Executive Council. The Executive Council shall consider the suggestions made by the General Council, and take such actions thereon as it thinks fit. The Executive Council shall inform the General Council at its next meeting of all the actions taken by it or the reasons for not taking any action.

FINANCIAL ESTIMATES (Clause 25 of the Schedule to the WBNUJS Act)

1. The Executive Council shall prepare, before such date, as may be prescribed by regulations, the financial estimates for the ensuing year and place the same before the General Council.
2. The Executive Council may, in the case where expenditure, in excess of the amount provided in the budget is to be incurred or in the case of urgency, for reasons to be recorded in writing, incur expenditure, subject to such conditions and restrictions as may be specified in the regulations. In cases where no provision has been made in the budget, in respect of such excess expenditure, a report shall be made to the General Council at its next meeting.

This is the Seventeenth Annual Report for the period from April, 2017 to March, 2018, which is being submitted to the General Council for its consideration and appropriate action. This report, as required, is accompanied by the audited accounts for the mentioned period.

Chapter II

Changes in the Constitution of the University Bodies

According to the terms of Section 8 of the WBNUJS Act, 1999, the authorities of the University shall be (1) the General Council, (2) the Executive Council, (3) the Academic Council, (4) the Finance Committee and such other authorities as may be declared by the University. Composition of these bodies has been prescribed in the Schedule to the Act.

Chapter V

Academic Programmes

Introduction

The academic programme of the West Bengal National University of Juridical Sciences (WBNUJS) has been designed so as to give the students a comprehensive exposure to all facets of jurisprudence and the legal system and to prepare them to enter the profession with requisite knowledge, skills and values. It is no accident that within a short span of ten years, NUJS has acquired the reputation of being a centre of excellence in legal education.

In order to equip the students with a comprehensive understanding of national and international laws, a large array of compulsory, optional and non-professional courses are offered both at the undergraduate and post-graduate levels.

The faculty consists of specialists from various fields of law and a number of social science disciplines such as Economics, Political Science, Sociology, and History. Eminent scholars and various experts from different fields are regularly invited to deliver special lectures and interact with the students on important issues and topics.

The University carries out its academic activities through seven Schools, specializing in different branches of law and Social Sciences. Each school has a dedicated group of faculty members. They are not only engaged in conducting the regular coursework of their respective Schools but are also involved in various other academic activities within the School, like organizing workshops and seminars, conducting researches, preparing projects and bring out publications.

In accordance with felt needs, the University has established several Centers to focus on specialized areas of law.

The University provides opportunities and encourages the students to organize and participate in various extra-curricular activities and competitions within, as well as outside the University.

The students of this University have brought immense honor to their institution by earning accolades in Moot Court competitions and Debates in India and abroad.

Within the University, the Student Juridical Association (SJA) co-ordinates various extra-curricular activities through the literary and Debating Society, the Cultural Affairs Committee, the Magazine Committee, the sports Committee and the Nature Club.

Different Programmes of Study offered by the University

The *B.A. /B.Sc. LL.B. (Hons.) Degree Programme* attracts school (Higher Secondary) leaving bright young aspirants to the field of law. The five-year undergraduate course is divided into ten semesters. The students represent almost all the states of India including foreign countries. This programme exposes the students to Indian modes of legal education (which emphasize critical thinking and self-inquiry) as well as to procedure and substantive law. It also enhances the students' ability to do advanced scholarly work. During the period under report 2017 - 18, 158 students has passed out and will be awarded the degree of LL.B. & LL.M. during the **Thirteenth Convocation** to be held on 3rd February, 2019 at the NUJS Auditorium.

The *LL.M. Degree Programme* is a one-year post-graduate course with 42 seats. This programme has been so devised as to attract intellectually curious and thoughtful candidates. In 2017 - 18, 39 students (including batch repeaters) will be awarded this degree during the **Thirteenth Convocation** to be held on 3rd February 2019 at the NUJS Auditorium.

With effect from 2013, the University has adopted one-year *LLM Programme* as per the direction of U.G.C. All the students of Post Graduate (LLM) are admitted through CLAT (Common Law Admission Test) during the academic year 2017-18, 41 students were admitted.

During the Academic year 2017-18, 14 candidates were admitted for Ph.D. course and the 5 candidates will be awarded Ph.D. Degree for the Academic year 2017-18.

2. The MHR Chair for IPR, since November 2008. Presently the Chair has performed the following activities during the last year under the guidance of Dr. Anirban Mazumdar, Coordinator, IPR Chair.
3. Sir Asutosh Mookerjee Chair has been established in the year 2015-16. The Chair has been professed by Mr. Sudeesh Pai, an eminent senior Advocate of Karnataka High Court who takes classes and offers Lectures in the University at regular intervals.

Chapter IX

NUJS Library & Information Centre

Growth of NUJS library over the past one year, both in volume and quality of content, has been significant and sustained.

Books & Journals: As of 31 March 2018 the library collection stood at 20095 in addition to gifted books which were 65342. A total of 371 titles were purchased and added to the book collection. Titles in the following subject areas were added which has enhanced the library collection: Legal Research, Criminal Law & Criminology, Corporate Law, Environmental Law, Trade Law, Arbitration to mention a few. The library renewed its subscription to 100 journals including leading international publications. Where options permitted print + online versions were subscribed to.

Online Databases: The library renewed its subscription to all online databases - Westlaw, Hein Online, LexisNexis, JSTOR, SCC Online, Kluwer package on Arbitration & Conciliation, Oxford Reports on International Law, and Max Planck Encyclopaedia of Public International Law, Manupatra, Lexis Nexis India, TDM online databases, Oxford E- Books, Cambridge E- Books and E-Journals.

Newly added online databases: I-Law, Investor-State Law Guide & Wiley Online Library.

E- Books: 777 (Total)

Institutional Memberships: The library renewed its membership with DELNET. Students were facilitated to access the collection held by the Centre of Studies in Social Sciences.

External Users: The library also provided access to over 600 persons in the past year. This included students from other national and international universities, practicing advocates, academics and professionals.

24x7: As per norm Library access was made available to students 15 days prior to and during the entire duration of their end semester examinations 24x7. It remained open 20 hours on other days.

Facilities: Printing, photocopying, scanning were continued.

Chapter X

Journals of the University

NUJS Law Review

The NUJS Law Review, launched in 2008, is the most effective journal of The W.B. National University of Juridical Sciences (NUJS), Kolkata. The Journal is a student- initiative and a brainchild of our Former Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Prof. M.P. Singh. Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Prof. P. Ishwara Bhat has currently served as the Editor-in-Chief. It is managed by a 'Board of Editors' and a body of Associate Members, and provides an exclusive platform to the student and faculty community at NUJS and outside, to publish their work.

The Journal has slowly gained importance in the legal arena. The professional and academic circles in India found it most effective for quality legal research. It is the only Law Review to be published by any National Law School on a quarterly basis. The Washington and Lee University School of Law ranking of law journals 1 ranked the NUJS Law Review the highest in India, with a combined score of 100.

Journal of Indian Law and Society (JILS)

The Indian Juridical Review – has been re-christened as Journal of Indian Law and Society and has already been published. The main objective of the journal is to analyze recent and past legal issues through a prism of sociology, political sciences, history, economics and other social sciences.

The Journal of Indian Law and Society continued in its work of being a forum for inter-disciplinary scholarship and debate.

Chapter XI

Endowments

Prof. N. R. Madhava Menon Media Law Endowment

On April 2001, WBNUJS received an endowment of Rs. 3 Lakhs from the founder Vice Chancellor of NUJS, Professor N. R. Madhava Menon, for promotion of the scholarship in Media Law, a subject he himself taught at WBNUJS. The Executive Council of the University, vide Resolution No. 5 of 2.2.2002, approved the Media Law Endowment Fund, and directed a long-term deposit to accrue the best interest possible.

Proceeds from the endowment are intended to be utilized for one or more of the following activities to be organized by the University on the recommendation of the Faculty Council and the Vice Chancellor.

- i. Award one or more Professor N. R. Madhava Menon Media Law Scholarships of the value of Rs. 6000.00 to the under graduate or post graduate students as part of their curriculum fees;
- ii. Award Professor N. R. Madhava Menon Media Law Fellowship to a scholar, jurist or journalist, to deliver a lecture on Media Law to the faculty and students of NUJS;
- iii. Organize a Seminar or Workshop, involving lawyers and journalists, as part of the curricular education on Media-related law subjects;
- iv. Give an annual award to a Reporter/Correspondent for excellent reportage of law based issues in Indian newspapers, journals or law reports; or
- v. Any other related activities, which contributes towards the advancement of scholarship in Media Law.

The University shall keep the endowment in perpetuity, and shall only use the interest every year, for the different kinds of related activities.

Keshab Chandra Basu Endowment on Law & Economics

Professor Kaushik Basu, Professor of Economics in Cornell University, USA, and son of Late Mr. Keshab Chandra Basu, who was a lawyer and a politician of repute in post independence Bengal, desired to give an endowment of Rs. 3 lakhs to promote the study of law-economics interface in WBNUJS. The Academic Council, and the Executive Council, in their meetings dated 26.10.2002, welcomed the offer and directed the University to set up the "Keshab Chandra Basu Memorial Lecture in Law and Economics" and authorized the Vice Chancellor to proceed with the various other related academic programmes.

It was decided that the University would organize a lecture series every year, by inviting distinguished scholars in the field from different parts of the world. Professor Basu had also promised to help in bringing such scholars to NUJS. Professor Amartya Sen delivered the first Keshab Chandra Basu Memorial Lecture on "Law, Economics and Social Change", on December 20, 2003.

Scholarly eminent personalities in the field of Law and other allied fields like Professor Pranab Bardhan, Mr. Narayana Murthy, Chief Mentor, Infosys, Professor Joseph Stiglitz, Lord Prof. Meghnad Desai, Dr Montek Singh Ahluwalia, Shri Pranab Mukherjee, Smt. Medha Patkar, Prof. Ved P Nanda of Denver, Mr. Lawrence Liang have visited this University to deliver this Lecture in this University.

The Eleventh Keshab Chandra Basu Endowment Lecture on "Reviving Investment and Sustaining High Growth : Need to Build State Capacity" was delivered by Dr. M. Govinda Rao, held on 4th December 2017 at the WBNUJS Auditorium.

Dr.Durgadas Basu Memorial Lecture Fund

Dr. Sardindu Basu son of Late Dr. Durgadas Basu donated Rs.9. Lakhs towards instituting the "Dr.Durgadas Basu Memorial Lecture" in the name of his illustrious father, for the organization of an annual lecture on Constitutional law at WBNUJS.

Mr. Fali S. Nariman, President, Bar Association of India, Supreme Court of India delivered the first Dr. D.D. Basu Lecture on "*The Silences in our Constitutional Law*" on October 29, 2005.

Hon'ble Mr. Justice M. N. Venkatachaliah delivered the second Dr. D. D. Basu lecture on "*The Constitutional World of Dr. Durgadas Basu Common Law, Humanism and Constitutions*" on 28/11/2007.

The first M.K. Nambyar endowment lecture was delivered by Mr. Michael Kirby, Former Justice of the High Court of Australia on 'The Necessity and Limitations of Judicial Activism'.

A discussion session "The Contribution of Bar to Public Law was conducted. Mr. Michael Kirby, Prof. P.P. Road, N.L. Mitra . Prof. Uday Raj Rao, and Prof. P. Ishwara Bhat participated in the discussion. Justice Amit Talukdar presided over the discussion.

Chapter XII

RECRUITMENT PROGRAMME - PLACEMENTS & HIGHER STUDIES

The W.B. National University of Juridical Sciences (NUJS) Kolkata recorded the highest number of placements across all National Law Universities (NLUs) in the country for its graduating Batch of 2018. A total number of 84 students (graduating batch of 113 students) were placed in the recruitment process, either by the Campus Recruitment Committee ("CRC") or through offers outside the college recruitment process (as illustrated by the table below).

Among the students who were placed through the campus recruitment process, the average annual packages offered by foreign law firms ranged from INR 42-46 lakhs, top domestic law firms ranged from INR 15-18 lakhs while the students joining companies in the role of in-house counsels received packages ranging from INR 12-14 lakhs.

Notably, the students in the batch of 2018 have also opted for a range of diverse career paths. A substantial number of students opted out of recruitment process in order to prepare for civil and judicial services examinations while a number of them have opted to pursue higher studies in foreign universities as well. This performance by the students of the Batch of 2018 is a reflection of the continued commitment to excellence which NUJS has strived to maintain over the years.

Such an achievement would not have been possible without the incredible efforts of all the CRC members, past and present, and the support of our current faculty advisor Prof (Dr) Anirban Mazumdar along with the previous faculty advisor, Ms. Vaneeta Pattnaik, and all the faculty members and the entire administrative staff at NUJS. We would also like to acknowledge our indebtedness to our alumni network whose fantastic support and guidance ensured these results.

ALTERNATE DISPUTE RESOLUTION (ADR) SOCIETY

The Alternative Dispute Resolution Society since last year has endeavoured to nurture the culture of active participation in ADR events, competitions and conferences. As law students we have always believed that the knowledge of all forms of dispute resolution is essential for us to perform our duty as lawyers, and since ADR is the future of dispute resolution, it is crucial to expose students to its diverse facets. The purpose of the society was to spread awareness about ADR activities at NUJS and give a platform to anyone who is interested in ADR to receive training and represent the University at both a national and an international level.

Practice Sessions for Mediation, Negotiation and Client Counselling

With a view to building a culture for doing well at ADR Competitions and winning laurels for the University, the ADR Society conducted practice sessions for mediation, negotiation and client counselling. Mock

problems were used and extensive feedback was given to participants. Attending at least one practice session was made compulsory for anyone representing the University at a competition, as per the new ADR Policy. The society has also played an active role in vetting the applications of the University to international competitions, to ensure that NUJS gets selected to participate at international competitions. Resultantly, NUJS was accepted to participate at the ICC Paris Mediation Competition, the ELSA Maynooth Negotiation Competition and the CDRC Vienna Negotiation Competition. The practice sessions have also led to stellar performance at both national and international competitions, with NUJS bringing home laurels at almost every single competition it has been represented in. The details of the same have been listed in the last section below.

ADR-ODR International Mediation Training Programme

In lieu of this ethos, the society has conducted various training programmes such as the ADR-ODR Mediation Training Program conducted by reputed mediator Mr. Rahim Shamji and his team. During this program 27 students were trained over the course of 6 days in the subject of mediation, its practical usage and its methodology in 2017. At the completion of this program, the mediators received a certification from ADR-ODR as Certified Civil and Commercial Mediators. Based on the continued enthusiasm and interest of the student body in the field of negotiation and mediation, the Society conducted the ADR-ODR Mediation Training Program again in January, 2018 at NUJS for 18 students and also hosted students from other universities in India.

Mediation and Negotiation Internals

The society was responsible for conducting the Intra-University Negotiation Internals in 2016. This year, we have taken this a step further and have become one of the first law schools to have dedicated Intra-University Mediation Internals in addition to the negotiation internals. The internals saw participation from about 250 students in total. This helped spread awareness about what mediation is in the University.

We have been fortunate to receive guidance from some of the top student negotiators from India, who drafted the problem and judged the internal rounds. We also hosted reputed and seasoned mediators such as Tanu Mehta and Prathamesh Popat to preside over the mediation internals.

Indian Mediation Week

The society was also the institutional support for the Indian Mediation Week held at NUJS. During this week, the ADR Society hosted Tara Ollapally and Annapurma Sreehari from the Centre for Advanced Mediation Practice ("CAMP") which conducted a mediation training and advocacy workshop for students of NUJS to further the discourse on mediation in the University.

Other Activities

This year, ADR Society drafted the general policy for the functioning of the society and also the allocation policy for competitions, which brings transparency and accountability and also sets a precedent for the future conduct of the society.

By a unanimous vote, the Society shifted from a system wherein the directors are appointed by a nomination from previous directors to a more democratic system wherein the directors are elected by an anonymous vote from the society.

This year we have added another feather to our cap by surpassing the NLS MUN & HNLU International MUN in the term of participants across the world, to become the largest law-school MUN in the country. We became India's Largest Law School MUN, not only in terms of delegates who attended our 7th edition but also by occupying the largest social media presence in terms of advertisements and reach vis-a-vis the rest similar events across the nation. True to its spirit of providing the best of opportunities to all the delegates participating, NUJS MUN Society followed a SEVA scheme to empower the participants and bridge the information gap between the Executive Board, International Press and the delegates. SEVA symbolised the 4-tier approach of Service of quality & Ensuring Variety Accessibility and Availability. At NUJS MUN 2018, delegates gained insight into the workings of the United Nations and the dynamics of international relations by assuming the roles of world leaders and international decision makers. NUJS SPORTS COMMITTEE

This year has been a defining year for the Sports Committee as not only have we done everything our predecessors did, better than they ever did, but also because we have enacted a great degree of change in the college as well as in the committee.

This year, we raised the standard of sports in our college and have created several fantastic memories to look back on. The event calendar for the NUJS Sports Committee 2017-18 remained ever packed, including the Open Frisbee Tournament, 3*3 Basketball, Foosball, Inter-batch Pool, Tug of War as well as Quad Cricket. All these events made up our informal section of events. We took part in the marathon organised by SAI and had Fifa come down to our University to organise a competition where they gave away tickets and viewing passes for the U-19 World Cup. Moreover, the Committee for Teachers' Day organised several sporting competitions between the Faculty and the Student Body such as carom, foosball and chess and badminton in which students were thoroughly creamed.

Throughout the year, the Committee hosted our usual formal tournaments including inter batch football, basketball, cricket, chess, carrom, table tennis and whatnot. This is in addition to the fact that we continued to host Quadball and NUJS Premier League with the monetary stakes increasing in each year.

We have hosted two inter college events within the span of two weeks namely, the Trilateral Series, a competition for sporting excellence between NLS, NUJS and NALSAR which was won by NUJS by a margin of just a point. The Committee also hosted NUJS's Flagship Sports fest, Invicta and Para-Invicta 2018, hosting the highest ever number of participants in the history of Invicta. We added a new sport to Invicta in the form of hockey and provided the best venues and fields available. Those who participated had the opportunity to play in the new SAI Football grounds, state of the art facilities provided to the Committee by SAI. We also hosted the second edition of ParaInvicta which saw participation from across the country as we strive to make our efforts towards making sport accessible to everybody.

In terms of infrastructure, the Committee has completely redone the recreation room with new lights, posters, speakers, pool equipment and not to mention, a PS4. We have purchased new goalposts for the quad and purchased inventory worth absurd amounts of money to the point that we had 11 footballs in this college at one point of time. We have built an inventory room for the storage of inventory so that it may be reused and unnecessary expenditure on inventory every year can be directed elsewhere. We purchased a new mat and cemented the pitch area for cricket. There are new badminton poles purchased which are portable and can be set up in any area. We have tried to purchase equipment in such a manner that it can be set up in small spaces and people can perhaps enjoy sports even in the little space in college.

The committee has passed a constitution for the first time in its history detailing out a democratic structure for the functioning of this committee and has in fact introduced a new criteria and panel system for the selection of the university team so that, the arbitrariness in sport in this university is removed.

The Sports Committee successfully delivered two fests in the month of February, namely- INVICTA'18 and ParaINVICTA'18. Around 1000 students, in addition to NUJS teams, from 30 colleges across the country participated in INVICTA'18, this number being the highest till date.

CYBER COMMITTEE

1. In the monsoon semester, we held the first ever open counter strike tournament. It received a positive response from the General Body and saw large number of people viewing the event.
2. The Cyber Committee also renewed the Air VPN subscription which enabled it to accept large download requests. Over 1TB of new data which included movies, TV shows and games was added. The Cyber Committee purchased the Amazon Fire stick and got an open network in the mess for it to function. However, due to the condition of the television we couldn't set up Netflix in the mess.
3. In the winter semester, we upgraded the DC server which was over 6 years old at this point and also added 4tb worth of extra storage.
4. In collaboration with the SJA, we installed a powerful router for the library which can handle over 170 devices. This router has solved the bandwidth bottleneck which was present in the library and has enabled students to use internet at high speeds in the library even during peak periods such as moot internals and examinations.
5. We also held the first ever Counter Strike League where teams were auctioned. The tournament also received a positive response from the GB and we also managed to raise more than the announced prize money which was subsequently given to the winners.
6. In addition to this Cyber Committee aided and assisted the General Body with their internet problems. This was inclusive of but not limited to configuring routers, installing windows and other necessary software and solving other laptop and mobile related problems.
7. Throughout the year, we maintained the squid proxy server and the DNS server to ensure that internet connectivity was not disrupted.

SOCIETY FOR THE ADVANCEMENT OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE

8. Conducted the second episode of **Discourse** – our student talk series had Ramya Chandrasekhar speak on the vulnerabilities of algorithms and the biases that are imported into the data that we believe is infallible.

The Theatre Team saw a change in organisation with increased flexibility in terms of participation and more autonomy to the Team. The team was renamed as "Krishna" after the man himself.
2. **Teacher's Day Celebration-** The teacher's day saw mesmerising musical performances by Purnendu, Jayanth BJ and Prathameesh which was followed by a Teachers vs. Student Antakshari Competition.
3. **Theatre Production-** NUJS Krishna had the best of acting talents at display with productions like *Mulk*, *Manto aur Maachis* and *Any Number Can Die*.
4. **Inter - batch Patriotic Song Competition -** Independence day was celebrated by the entire college with every batch coming out with stellar renditions of patriotic songs after the flag hoisting. The 5th years stole the show though and won the competition followed by the 3rd years.

NATURE COMMITTEE

The Nature Committee was revived after a period of three years. In its first year post-revival, it successfully effected the following:

1. Tie-up with 'Vital Waste' for effective segregation and management of bio-degradable wastes.
2. Plantation drive for beautification of campus and garden areas.
3. Procurement and placement of new eco-friendly dustbins in the academic block and hostels for collection of recyclable waste.

STUDENT JURIDICAL ASSOCIATION

1. Launch of SJA website and social media handles

Envisioned to promote NUJS' public relations drive, the SJA website not only created an efficient platform for portrayal of student and committee achievements but also opened an avenue for highlighting positive aspects about the University in general. With information about committees, visitors' testimonials, faculty and staff directories, and handy links to important documents, the SJA website today serves as single window for information dispersal both within and outside the University.

Over the course of one year, the website has featured a wide variety of content including news on mootings, debating and scholarly achievements, public statements on issues confronting our peers from other law schools, faculty and student editorial publications, and a series of alumni interviews such as 'Entrepreneurs of NUJS' and 'In the Service of the Nation'. As a result, the website has become a melting pot of NUJS achievements and culture. The website has also served as the first point of publication for joint statements released by the student bodies of NLSIU, NALSAR and NUJS under extraordinary circumstances. Some stories on the website were directly picked up by mainstream and legal media, boosting both our print and online presence.

Driven by the back-support from the SJA website, the SJA also launched NUJS' official Facebook and Twitter handles (operated by its Press Secretaries) to actively promote the NUJS brand within the law school circuit and beyond. NUJS became a trendsetter among NLUs to have such a presence on social media – in line with other top-league institutions in the country. While the Twitter handle was unilaterally usurped by the administration subsequently, the SJA continues to operate and regularly update the Facebook handle.

Apart from facilitating circulation of SJA website's content on social media, the Facebook handle also facilitates direct engagement of law aspirants with the University, tackling scores of admission queries pertaining to all the offered courses every admission season.

The SJA also designed a new official website for the Library (nujslibrary.org) which among other features includes regular updates on latest arrivals (books and journals), previous question papers, et al. This is expected to increase the accessibility of library resources.

2. Launch of the SJA Mobile App

Being the first-ever app for a student body, it currently features a campus social networking site, campus news and videos, NUJS history, events, alumni network, mess menu updates, a maintenance form, suggestions form, updates on new credit courses, library services, NUJS' visitors comments and testimonials, credit course updates and information on the SJA team. The app was made available for download across all mobile platforms – Android, iOS, Windows and Blackberry, and is currently live on Google Play Store (Legally India).

3. Launch of NUJS AlmaConnect

After two years of persistent efforts, we finally subscribed to AlmaConnect (NUJS) – funded entirely out of the SJA budget (2017-18). AlmaConnect serves as a private professional social network exclusively for NUJS students, alumni and faculty, and will enable us to connect with and leverage our alumni network. This makes NUJS one of the three NLUs presently availing the service.

For Academic Year 2017-18, the SJA played an active role in the CLAT Admission Process. To make the incoming batch acquainted with the University and the surroundings, a "Beginners' Guide to NUJS Life" was prepared by the SJA and released during the CLAT Admission Process. Later, the SJA also put up a help-desk at the Pool of Justice to address all queries of incoming students and their parents.

The 'Midnight Meal' services were successfully introduced for the period of all the end-semester examinations for the convenience of students. Similarly, 'The Food Truck' provided food services at subsidised rates for majority of two semesters

The SJA also facilitated a tie-up with OYO Rooms, whereby students and various student-run committees were offered heavily discounted rates for lodging during their internships and for University events, respectively

A small team, comprising of two Assistant Registrars, one Accounts Officer, one Campus Supervisor, a PA to the Vice Chancellor, a PA to the Registrar, one Librarian, one Assistant Librarian, one Accountant, six Library Assistants, thirteen D.E.O.s, one Technical Assistant, one PA to the Computer Centre, thirteen Office / Library Attendants, a Telephone Operator- cum - Recreationalist and a couple of Driver-cum-Attendants constitute the entire administration of the University.

Dr. S. A. Khan, Co-ordinator, SPLCJ took over the charge as Registrar (Acting) w.e.f. July 2016 till date.

The Vice-Chancellor is the Chief Executive of the University.

Admission and Examination

Admission

Finance, Accounts And Audit

Sources of Fund

The main source of finance of the University Fund is generated through revenue from the fees etc. received from the students, workshops and research projects, apart from the interests accrued from the bank. It also receives donations from individuals and institutions to support specific activities. Moreover, it receives grants-in-aid from the UGC and Government of West Bengal from time to time.

LLB Scholarship

With a view to promote higher academic pursuit in legal studies to the student of NUJS, scholarships of Rs 5,85,600.00 (100% waiver on tuition fee), Rs.14,72,440.00 (75% waiver of tuition fee), Rs. 2,96,900.00 (50% waiver on tuition fee) and Rs 1,76,215.00 (25% waiver on tuition fee) totalling to Rs. 25,31,155.00 have been awarded under 'NUJS Merit cum Means' and 'Need Based Scholarship' Schemes for the year 2017-2018.

Donations for Moot Court and Debating Activities

Students of NUJS participated in several International Moots, Debating Competitions, International Arbitration, and various courses during the year and earned laurels. Their efforts were financially supported by benevolent contributions from members of the legal fraternity, from Individual, from national and multinational companies as mentioned below:

Educational Loan

The University tries to ensure that no student is compelled to discontinue his/her studies due to financial constraints. It encourages students to be self-reliant. It has been so arranged that the students can approach any bank of their choice for a loan which is immediately sanctioned, subject to the observance of statutory formalities, with or without any collateral securities as the case may be. Banks when approached by NUJS students, have also responded favourably by quickly sanctioning Education Loans. State Bank of India, Oriental bank of Commerce, Punjab National Bank, Corporation Bank, Union Bank of India, Andhra Bank, Indian Bank, Central bank of India, United Bank of India and Allahabad Bank are some of the Nationalised Banks from whom loans have been availed by the NUJS students. Other Banks have also shown keen interest in this regard.

Investments:

The University fund investment in 8% GOI Bonds as on 31.03.2018 stands at Rs. 1186.76 lakhs, Provident Fund Rs. 50.00 Lakhs and Refundable deposit Rs. 35.00 lakhs. In addition, investment in other fixed and flexi deposits in nationalised banks aggregate to Rs. 80.50 Crores as on 31.03.2018 for various activities.

Annual Accounts and Audit

The annual accounts of the University for the year 2017-18 was prepared as per the provision of the WBNUJS Act & Regulations. These have been audited by the statutory auditors, M/S.Sen & Company. Their reports are appended as Part-B of this submission.

NUJS: A Developing University

The UGC grants received by the University are utilized for general development activities under XIIth Plan. However, to meet the running expenses grants from Govt. of West Bengal as well as Govt. of India are very much required. The Govt. of West Bengal have started funding maintenance Recurring expenses grants w.e.f. April, 2017 on yearly basis which would aggregate atleast to Rs.4.30 Lacs for the financial year 2018-19.

Annual Accounts 2017-18

Explanatory Memorandum:

The Annual Accounts of The W.B. National University of Juridical Sciences, Kolkata for the year 2017-18 were audited by the Statutory Auditors, M/s Sen and Co., Chartered Accountants, Kolkata. The Accounts comprised of Receipts and Payments Account and Income-Expenditure Account of the University for the year ended 31st March 2018 as well as a Balance Sheet as on that date. According to the Auditors, these accounts give a true and fair view of the affairs of the University.

The University is presently functioning at its full strength from its own building. While basic infrastructure is in place, the University is in the process of building up essential support services for lifting up the academic standards and improving campus facilities.

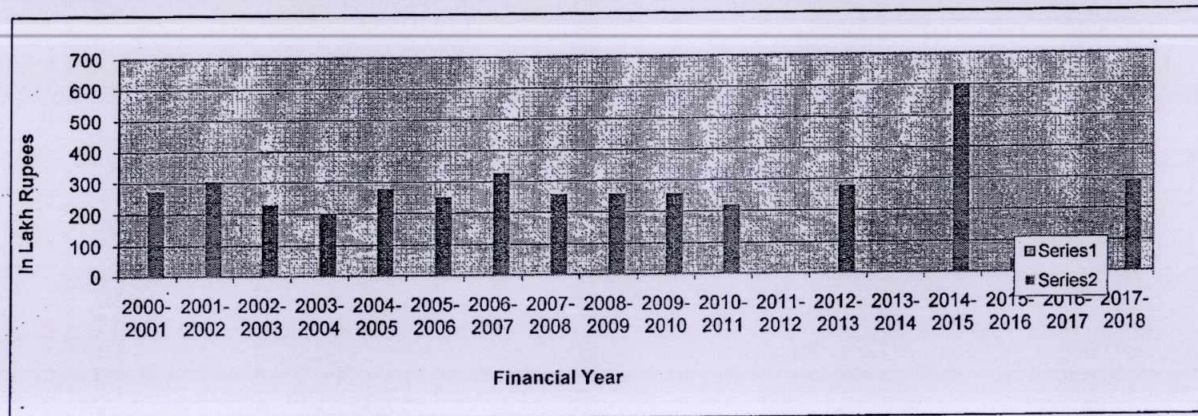
This is the "Fifteen" accounting year of the University. Over the past years, the financial position of the University has witnessed progressive growth., as could be seen from the comparative study tabulated in Annexure "A".

Some of the salient aspects are mentioned briefly:

- A. The Govt. of West Bengal, as stated above, have started for providing financial support from financial year 2017-2018 in the form of Maintenance grants. The University had received Rs. Rs.287.76 Crore out of Rs. 4.30 Crores
- B. Accumulations in various funds of the University at the end of 2017-18 aggregated to Rs. 93.22 Lakhs, an improvement of Rs.1464.00 Lakhs over the previous year.
- C. Value of fixed assets at cost including buildings stood at Rs. 4331.00 Lakhs as on 31.03.2018. Investment of funds including GOI bonds, increased to Rs. 9322.00 Lakhs in 2017-18 from Rs. 7858.12 Lakhs in 2016-17 i.e., an increase of Rs. 1464 Lakhs over previous year.
- D. Total amount of fees received from students during 2017-18 was Rs. 1496.13 Lakhs, an increase of Rs. 0.11 lakhs over the previous year. Interest and income other than students fee stood at Rs. 1102.00 lakhs in 2017-18 i.e., increase of Rs. 365.00 lakhs from previous year 2016-17.
- E. Total running expenses of the University for the Financial Year 2017-18 was Rs. 1142 lakhs which was modest.

It prima facie revealed that the fixation of pay of non-teaching staff of the University at the time of revision, consequent upon 6th CPC recommendations, might not have been done according to the applicable rules framed by the Central Government <i>in toto</i>. Registrar (Acting) submitted a note to the Vice-Chancellor highlighting that any erroneous fitment of pay in the revised scale effective from 1st January 2006 is bound to have a cascading effect on the adoption of the recommendations of 7th CPC, which is in the offing. He suggested that in the best interest of the University, therefore, the matter calls for a comprehensive review. (Note of the Registrar Acting attached and was marked 'C').</p> <p>As a considerably long period has elapsed, it will neither be feasible, nor desirable, to entrust the work to be undertaken to any internal manpower resource. In order to ensure total objectivity and full transparency, it is proposed to constitute a two or three-members expert committee which may comprehensively review the application of revised scales of pay to all employees of the University, as made under the 6th CPC recommendations. The same committee may also be entrusted with the responsibility of fixation of fitment under 7th pay commission for its implementation after removing the anomalies.</p> <p>The aforesaid matter was placed before the 97th Meeting of the Finance Committee held on 16/11/2017. of the Finance Committee unanimously decided as follows :

"It has been claimed by some of the employees of the University that there is disparity of pay amongst the equals and benefits of the 6th pay commission report was not extended equally to all employees. They claim parity in the matter of pay.

The Committee members have been appraised that since 2006 there has been incorrect assignment of the pay scale to a large number of employees who have over drawn salary in excess to their entitlement for several years and the University coffer have been drained out in Crores.

The Committee member have noted the issue with great concern and recommended that immediate steps be taken for rectifying the error, if any, at the earliest. The Committee members recommended that a three members committee be constituted consisting of three recently retired officers, one from Finance Department, Government of West Bengal, one from the office of Principal Accountant General, West Bengal and one retired Judicial Officer.

The said committee would look into the matter of the erroneous fixation of the pay scale and fitment, if any, of all the employees and officers of the University since 1st January, 2006 and make an estimate of the excess amount paid to the employees and make suggestion for recovery or adjustment of the excess amount, if any, if permitted by the law.

The members have been informed that the recommendation of the 7th Pay Commission report has to be implemented with effect from 1st January, 2016. The Committee shall also give their suggestion with regard to fixation of pay and fitment of the officers and employees of the University as per 7th Pay Commission recommendation after removing the anomalies.

The matter shall be placed before Executive Council for approval and further direction."

The matter was put for further discussions and directions.

Resolution

The Executive Council decided that the issue of the erroneous pay fixation and removing of anomalies need to be dealt with separately from implementation of the 7th Pay Commission report.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES & NOTES ON ACCOUNTS

A) SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. The Accounts of the year are prepared on the basis of cost and with fundamental assumption of going concern concept,
2. Items of expenditure are recognized on accrual basis. Income is recognized on cash / accrual basis.
3. Revenue Recognition:
 - i) Interest on Investment is recognized on accrual basis
 - ii) Interest on earmarked funds are credited to the respective funds.
4. All depreciable Fixed Assets are shown at cost of acquisition inclusive of inward freight, duties, taxes, incidental and direct expenses related to acquisition.
5. Depreciation is provided on all depreciable assets applying rates as per Income Tax Act 1961.
6. The value of inventory is recognized at cost price following weighted average method of valuation of closing stock.
7. Investments are carried at cost.
8. Grants from State Government/and UGC/Funds received from different sponsors for various projects are directly credited to University main account. Funds are transferred to the respective accounts of the projects subsequently for conducting their activities.
9. Foreign Currency transactions:

Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are normally recorded at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of transaction.
10. Salaries, Allowances and Retirement Benefits:
 - i) Salaries and Allowances are accounted on payment basis.
 - ii) No provision for Gratuity has been provided in the books of accounts.
 - iii) Leave encashment is accounted for on payment basis.



B) NOTES ON ACCOUNTS


1. The matter of rent payable by the corporation Bank from July 2008 on wards is under review and in negotiation with Bank Authority. Pending finalization, the rent credited to WBNUJS account will not be taken.
2. The matter of payment of Municipal Tax Bidhannagar Municipality as demanded by them is under negotiation with the Municipal Authority praying for total exemption from payment of any tax as the University is existing solely for education purpose and not for the purpose of profit.
3. No provision has been made in the accounts towards Municipal tax for the year 2017-18 as no demand has been received from the concerned authority.
4. Action regarding Internal Audit matter is under progress.
5. At the time of Bank Reconciliation Statement Verification, we found that a number of entries is awaiting to be accounted for several years. University Authority shall take steps to reconcile those entries.
6. Physical verification of Assets has been carried out by the management.
7. The opening balance of accounts are kept in Tally Systems of the University but due system error by way of being corrupt during the year under audit, the University authority had taken immediate steps to rectify the defect and the same had been rectified as well. Our audit is based on the rectified entries.
8. The advances taken by the staff and students should be adjusted within the particular financial year and adjustment should not be kept pending for a long time.
9. On account of up gradation of system of Corporation Bank, NUJS Branch with effect from August 2017, the service branch of the University, bank reconciliation with reference to the University Accounts could not be reconciled properly. The same should be taken up with the branch to regularise the unreconciled figures with priority.
10. Statutory dues are deposited by the University on regular basis.




11. No provision for Income Tax is considered necessary as the University is registered as a Charitable Institution u/s 12A (a) of Income Tax Act, 1961.
